If you have a Medicare card, you will have minimal out of pocket costs. People 18 and under and anyone with a Government concession/ healthcare card and a valid Medicare card will have no out of pocket expense for a consultation appointment.

Confidential Counselling

Our experienced counsellors can talk through the following issues in a safe and non-judgemental way:

Safer sex, STIs and BBVs



Past sexual assault / abuse

A booking is required to see a counsellor. Phone counselling is available by appointment. We accept mental health care plans.

Non-Judgemental Clinic

Our friendly team of doctors and nurses have a high level of training in the area of sexual health. Come and see us about:



Contraception, including implants, intrauterine devices and more



Sexually transmissible infections (STIs)



Cervical screening



Unintended pregnancy options, including information or referral



PrEP for HIV prevention



Please let our staff know ahead of time if you need an interpreter.



Youth Clinic: Every Thursday night from 5:30pm to 8pm we have a youth clinic! During this time, the clinic is open for young people aged 14 to 19.



All appointments will need a booking, some appointments can be booked online. Same day appointments may be available.
